Assistant Director-Department of Housing Services- Washington County

Josh has 15 plus years of experience in affordable housing and homeless program administration working with housing agencies across the U.S. and Europe. Josh started his career by working with high performing housing authorities in Washington State. His work included implementing large scale changes in policies in Seattle and Tacoma that helped increase affordable housing supply, added additional tenant services while streamlining administrative operations. As a German Chancellor in 2014/2015, Josh worked with the German, Dutch and Scottish Social Housing sectors helping to optimize programs while also partnering to outline policy alternatives in several housing organizations. Josh began working with homeless programs and Medicaid program as the Housing Administrator for Arizona's Medicaid Department (AHCCCS). In that role he brought together both housing subsidies and Medicaid covered services to help house thousands of Arizona's most vulnerable residents and worked to reshape the design of the programs. In his current role, Josh oversees both Washington County's federal public housing programs and homeless programs under an integrated County Department.
